President's message & YNA Background

The Yarra Netball Association (formerly Richmond Netball Association) was established in 1991 in an effort to provide structured netball competitions for the local community including school groups and individual community members.

We commenced junior competitions on an asphalt netball court at one of the local schools with approximately 15 children and as interest grew, we lobbied the local council for a more suitable netball venue within the City of Yarra. After years of lobbying, the Ryan's Reserve complex was built and has been our home ever since. We currently have over 950 registered members.

We run competitions for 9/U, 11/U, 13/U, 15/U, 17/U and Open ladies, as well as a grassroots program for 7- 10 year olds who have little or no netball experience. We have representative teams for the Association's best junior players, a well-established umpire mentor program, as well as delivering coaching courses & workshops.

The biggest achievement in our 30-year history is the re-development of the new courts and pavilion due to be finished March 2022.

We value deeply our affiliation with Netball Victoria. Our future focus must be on participation and growth in all areas of the game in Yarra - this includes players, umpires, and coaches, and our need to develop strategies of getting more children involved in netball post COVID. These aspirations have assisted to anchor and inform our new strategic plan.
